Drummoyne Power Junior Australian Football Club

Founded in 1999 with a single team of under 12s, Drummoyne Power now fields teams in age groups from the Auskick under 5/6s through to under 16s. With over 250 registrations and 16 teams in 2011 Drummoyne Power is now established as one of the largest junior football clubs competing in the Greater Sydney Juniors association. On any weekend during the season, over 200 players take the field wearing a black, silver and teal jumper.



In 2011, due to solid registrations, a season not overly disrupted by poor weather and a very busy post-season, more players played more games for Drummoyne Power than in any previous year.

Drummoyne Power's principle "catchment" zone includes a score of primary schools located in the suburbs of Haberfield, Leichhardt, Orange Grove, Rozelle, Balmain, Five Dock, Abbotsford, Drummoyne, Hunters Hill, Gladesville and Boronia Park.

Power play their home games at two venues; the Five Dock Oval and the newly refurbished Drummoyne Oval with its first class playing surface and substantial facilities for players, parents and spectators, the envy of all visitors.


Drummoyne Power JAFC achievements on-field, in operations and administration has been widely recognized by its peers and parent bodies. In 2011, for the fourth time in its 12 year history, the Club has been awarded the title of Sydney Harbor City Club of the Year (2002, 2007, 2009 and 2011).

Drummoyne Power draws strength from the enthusiasm and support of the now hundreds of boys, girls and families associated with the Club wearing black, silver and teal livery and their connections into the local community.

Developments in the Drummoyne Oval precinct

The newly constructed Drummoyne Oval Community Facility was officially opened on Thursday, 29 July 2010 by Anthony Albanese, Federal Minister for Infrastructure and Local Government and Labor Member for Lowe, John Murphy. This follows a successful \$5.3 million grant application through the Government's Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Projects program.

At the opening ceremony Mr. Albanese also announced that if re-elected, the Gillard Government would provide an additional \$1.75 million for the new floodlights for Drummoyne Oval. Council has since been advised that the Department of Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government will be providing this funding through the Community Organisation Infrastructure Grant Program.





A power upgrade is being undertaken at Drummoyne Oval. The cable runs are now complete, the switchboards have been installed. The new electronic scoreboard has been installed. The substations should be completed by early October.

Congratulations to all of our players and I hope you enjoyed your season. Hope to see you all back in 2012, tell your friends how much fun we have!





VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2011 has been a year characterised by sustainable growth and we are very proud of being awarded Club of the Year in the Sydney City competition for the third time in seven years. We have undertaken a series of planning workshops; have built more structures to promote skills development, participation and performance in our children, and most importantly engaging sponsors and volunteers effectively.

There were many contributors to a series of **planning workshops** in late 2010. With over 40 attendees, we focused our efforts in:

- Keeping our kids fit, having fun & performing well
- Identifying and developing coaches and managers
- Engaging parents in easy ways and promoting involvement

Some of the key improvements included the wet weather training options championed by Adrian Walton, getting the Coaching coordinators in place for Auskick (Adrian), Junior (Steve Wall) and Youth (Simon Ringer) with special assistance and mentoring from Rod Carter. 

Thanks also to all the volunteers who assisted with canteen duties during the year and contributed to a great year for our canteen.


Registration Fees


Year major income comparison:



Overall revenue in 2011 was on par with the prior year with registration fees being slightly better. Sponsorship money collected in 2011 was also slightly better with some longer term sponsors increasing their commitment in 2011. The revenue position is very good given the challenging times economically and is testament to strength of loyalty and support underpinning the club.

Drummoyne Oval upgrade

The Drummoyne upgrade has substantially now been completed during 2011. The new Grandstand and Canteen area is a great addition to the ground. The committee has established an area of club history in the middle grandstand by displaying photos, trophies and achievements. Honour boards have also been established and displayed to achieve a sense of club history and recognise those that have made significant contribution to the club.

The electrical upgrade was also completed and the electronic scoreboard set up. It will be in full use next year.

The final aspect of the upgrade scheduled for next year is the installation of lighting. The club will make a significant contribution towards the lighting and has funds aside in a deposit account for that purpose.

Nic and Darby had some home and away games this season to get started and both are showing promise for the coming seasons, keep up the good work.


Umpiring is a great way to be involved in the game, developing good communication skills and confidence, meeting new friends and people from different clubs; you also have the chance to earn some pocket money.

Starting point - recognising that: planning needed to improve

- the organisational structure needed to improve

- the club needed an extra person to assist aka Project Manager

Planning Workshops/Call to Action





Player profiles

Elliott Benson is a solid and determined defender in the making and able to adjust to both a man-on-man or zone structure. He always presents himself at a contest when the ball is in dispute and chases hard. During his first year his skills developed rapidly and he was always a great contributor.

Gabriella Stanwix played her second year with the club and has matured into a responsible, accountable defender. She took control of her zone when playing in the backline, organising the defensive structure and also looking to kick long into attack when she won the ball.

Alexander Lawson is a tall defender with the height to mark a resting ruckman but also the speed and agility to run with a small forward. More at home in defence than attack, he is always accountable for his man, but his clever play often sets up forward moves for his team mates.

Tom Gilmore seems to have found his position in the team as an attacking half back flanker. During the season he regularly put his body on the line as a defender but was also just as keen to pick up the back, run and drive it long into attack.

Marcus Hamilton joined the team this year and showed plenty of clean skills. He is a strong pack mark and his skills at centre half back complement Gabriella's at full back. His kicking skills also create opportunities for the centre and half forward lines.

Gilbert Hogg is a seasoned campaigner who has also developed into a natural defender. In 2011 he showed strong accountability for his opponent while in the defensive zone, but was also able to break free and provide options for his team mates when the ball was turned over.

Nathan Wrigley is quick and agile, with silky skills, making him a perfect fit on the wing of the Dream Team. His is a versatile team player and would be equally at home as the team's first rover and is a key member of our 'mosquito' fleet.

Cameron McLean, like the rest of the team's goal to goal line, possesses a long and accurate kick. He has taken this to the next level, working the ball cleanly on both side of his body. With his size and speed, Cameron is a natural centre-man.

Maxim Angelos is another player who stepped up in 2011 and regularly put his body on the line in search of hard ball gets. He forms part of the Dream Team's running midfield, which is equally competitive at stoppages and around packs.



Coach's Report - Andrew Hamilton



The season can best be described as one of great progression. As the 3 U10 coaches looked to allocate children to each of the teams the challenge was not going to be just teaching the boys the basic skills of the game but most importantly how to provide them with a great AFL experience and bond them together as a team rather than as a group of individuals.

With a relatively inexperienced group of senior players, we were thankful to have Nick Jenneke and Bryson Hart (50 game players) and second year players James Phillips and Joshua Hamilton in the team.

With a large influx of new players consisting of Thomas Hopper, Finn McDonald, Keiran Corcoran, Adam Marabani, Nicholas Zadow, Seb Pelligrino, Seb duPlessis, Josh Macdessi, Steven Wells and Dashiell Upton, we were still light on for experience.

It was challenging to settle the team with players regularly unavailable due to school and other sporting commitments, holidays and illness all part of the busy lives that everyone leads these days. These are all very common experiences.

The uncertainty of ground availability due to weather for training and washed out games made consistency of training and competition opportunities increasingly frustrating; thankfully we had the indoor cricket centre as an alternative training venue – a facility which few clubs would have.

The early games were all about teaching the boys a pre-game warm-up and the importance of preparing as a team – the important part to keep instructions simple. As the season built into the mid part of the season the boys began to gain some confidence and began to bond as a team. A tremendously competitive game against Moore Park at Heffron Park was a real turning point as the boys realised that applying pressure to a more skilful team would regularly see the ball turned over. For many of the boys it was their best game to that stage of the season.

The boys carried this form into the mid season gala day when they beat Concord and both the Black and very strong Teal teams in the first 3 games but had their confidence diminished when playing Maroubra and Easts in the last two games.

These last two games really seemed to hurt the boy's confidence and their fragility showed and they returned to their early season status.

Returning to and reinforcing the basics of using the voice, the importance of game day preparation and introducing some very simple team bonding concepts saw the team in the latter part of the season regain that confidence again and it began to return when they played Teal at Wagener Oval. While the boys were still somewhat disappointed with their performance, there were glimpses of teamwork returning.

The secret as is often the case is all in their preparation and pleasingly as the latter part of the season approached the boys began to prepare for games as a team — they found voice, knew the pre-game drills, how to present themselves and this was reflected in their performance.

The last two games of the season were highlights. Firstly against Maroubra Red at Drummoyne Oval and then against one of the strongest teams Easts Red. The boys' inexperience and lower skill levels were replaced with a tremendous tenacity for possession of the ball, physical influence on the opposition player with the ball and a preparedness to turn defence into attack, traits that often are the undoing of more skilful teams.

While many players were unavailable for the end of season gala day the Silver team was well represented in the Black and Teal teams and performed admirably. Nick Jenneke, Finn McDonald and Thomas Hopper were particularly influential in assisting Teal to reach the Grand Final.

There were numerous awards for the team and individuals this season:

The U/10 coaches introduced the weekly coach's encouragement award which was well received;
Nick Jenneke and Bryson Hart reached the 50 game milestone for the club;
Thomas Hopper, Finn McDonald and Nick Jenneke played in the end of season gala day Grand Final for Teal;
Nick Jenneke was selected for and played in U/10 Development Squad games; and
Joshua Hamilton received an Outstanding Achievement Award at the AFL's Awards evening.

Thank-you to Phil duPlessis for his support as TM in his first year at the club, to the Mums and Dads for their volunteer support with the various weekly team roles and for bringing your boys to training and games week in week out.

Congratulations to Nick Jenneke for winning the Best & Fairest, Finn McDonald for being Runner-Up in his first year and polling votes in every game he played and to Keiran Corcoran for being awarded the Coach's Encouragement Award in also his first year.

As a first year coach I enjoyed the experience immensely and look forward to coaching many of the boys again in 2012.




James Brookshaw - Began 2011, played 15 games. Solid fullback who gives 100%. Accurate long kick, strong mark and fierce competitor.


