Drummoyne Power Junior Australian Football Club

Founded in 1999 with a single team of under 12s, Drummoyne Power now fields teams in age groups from the Auskick under 5/6s through to under 16s. With over 250 registrations and 16 teams in 2011 Drummoyne Power is now established as one of the largest junior football clubs competing in the Greater Sydney Juniors association. On any weekend during the season, over 200 players take the field wearing a black, silver and teal jumper. In Round 6 a new club record of 231 players took the field



Drummoyne Power's principle "catchment" zone includes a score of primary schools located in the suburbs of Haberfield, Leichhardt, Orange Grove, Rozelle, Balmain, Five Dock, Abbotsford, Drummoyne, Hunters Hill, Gladesville and Boronia Park.

Power play their home games at two venues; the Five Dock Oval as a training venue and playing our home games at the newly refurbished Drummoyne Oval with its first class playing surface and substantial facilities for players, parents and spectators, the envy of all visitors.

Drummoyne Power JAFC achievements on-field, in operations and administration has been widely recognized by its peers and parent bodies. In 2011, for the fourth time in its 12 year history, the Club has been awarded the title of Sydney Harbor City Club of the Year (2002, 2007, 2009 and 2011).

Drummoyne Power draws strength from the enthusiasm and support of the now hundreds of boys, girls and families associated with the Club wearing black, silver and teal livery and their connections into the local community.

Developments in the Drummoyne Oval precinct



The newly constructed Drummoyne Oval Community Facility was officially opened on Thursday, 29 July 2010 by Anthony Albanese, Federal Minister for Infrastructure and Local Government and Labor Member for Lowe, John Murphy. This follows a successful \$5.3 million grant application through the Government's Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Projects program.

At the opening ceremony Mr. Albanese also announced that if re-elected, the Gillard Government would provide an additional \$1.75 million for the new floodlights for Drummoyne Oval. The Department of Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government will be providing this funding through the Community Organisation Infrastructure Grant Program.

We have had our first full season of operating with the electronic scoreboard. It has enhanced the experience of playing at Drummoyne for Power and visiting teams. Along with timekeeping and scoring, the LED board allows our sponsors to be prominently promoted as well as announcing player milestones and events.

The long awaited deployment of lights around the oval is imminent. The footings for the six light towers have been poured and the towers themselves are due to go up in the next few weeks.

In season 2013 we look forward to being able to conduct full training sessions being able to see the ball all around the playing surface with and maybe even the prospect of night football!

All involved in running juniors AFL Clubs do amazing jobs as volunteers and there are many helpful hands to ease the workload.





In 2012 web based payment and registration was introduced using the sporting Pulse website. PayPal was also introduced to give additional options for conveniently paying registration fees and other items.


Over 90% of all payments are now being made by credit card and online methods. This gives greater control and efficiencies in collecting registration fees.


Year major income comparison:

It was a pleasure to have the opportunity to help influence the most important age groups in our club for the 2nd season and what an exciting season it was with all 15 games and a number of gala days played without the weather getting in the way. Another highlight for Auskick was to play on our home ground for 6 of those 15 games where the facilities are 1st class & getting better. Apart from trying to give the best game day experience to all players we were also able to have 60 DJAFL Auskickers do the AFL ½ time event, the Under 8's attended a Swans Training session and the Swans & Giants also visited our club training nights.

AUSKICK NUMBERS

DJAFL Auskick numbers from Under 5's to Under 8's jumped again this season where we had 89 boys & girls play which was a 35% increase over the previous season and clearly creating a club record since its inception some 11 years ago.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

To complement this healthy increase we also had a very positive influx of committed parents some of whom very willing stepped up to take on coaching, team managing & other important volunteering roles in the club. We would also like to make special mention to the following people, among the many that make huge contributions:


- Alan Dunne the unsung hero behind the weekly club newsletter and website content maintainer who has handed over duties to Nicholas Lambropoulos in 2013

Volunteerism is what underpins the Drummoyne Power club, and is a key differentiator of our performance on and off the field.










The Round 16 fixture v Baulkham Hills at brought the curtain down on a remarkable team's career.

The team playing that game have stacked up an incredible 2,000 plus career games with Power and 17 of the squad completed their junior footy careers with a hard fought win.

Looking back at their history, you can see three phases. During their years in Auskick their numbers grew to 15 by 2004. Surnames like Firmin, Barnett, Ryan, Fish & Chomley were prominent in the Club news. But only one of the graduating group actually played Auskick with Power, the ever enduring James Enderby.

The rest of the Class of 2012 debuted as Under 9s or later when the group flourished under the watchful eye of Paul Foran and had some notable success. In the U12s the roster topped out at 30 and a joint venture with Concord was attempted with mixed results to give everybody on the list as much footy as possible.

2009 was their golden year when under the stewardship of the Ringer/Vozzo regime they swept all before them, unbeaten through the rounds and triumphed over Hornsby-Berowra in the Under 13s Grand Final. The 2010 season was also highly competitive until a rash of late season injuries saw their chances cruelled and they bowed out in the Preliminary Final to Newtown. The seasons as U16s was, how would you say character forming. Despite some notable recruits and quality returning players, the loss of almost all their experienced tall timber made for hard yakka. Though the wins were the few and the final margins often unhealthy the Power bench was always well populated for a group that enjoyed all aspects of their footy.

Already this group have eyes on an extended career, with more of them taking up the pathway through to the U18s with Balmain Dockers than previously. Some are playing in the U18s finals campaign this season.

There have been less than a dozen teams who have been awarded the title "Team of the Year" out of the hundreds that have played in the GSJ Youth competitions in at period. For one team to have won it twice ...

once when they were unbeatable and the other when they weren't competitive is a truly remarkable achievement and tribute to both them and their team management.



And last but not least - Adrian for his ongoing support & guidance, also to Brett for his magnificent managerial skills of both the teams.





Coach's Report - Clint Hawthorne

As the coach of a young team of footballers I see my challenge being to educate and teach my players about the basic skills of AFL football. I am pleased to announce that this year we have seen a remarkable improvement with all players in the team. Kicking, marking and handballing are largely the 3 skills that we have focused on this year however a large amount of time has also been spent on other tactics and skills of the game including, running to space, side stepping opposition players and keeping our feet. Overall our biggest focus throughout the year has been on team work and the importance of team work in a game situation.

With practice comes perfection, many of the parents and myself witnessed a remarkable change with the U8's team throughout 2012 and this was mainly due to ALL players constantly looking to use teamwork and the above mentioned new found skills in a game situation. On many occasions the U8's were able to dominate their opponents through the sheer amount of teamwork that our children displayed which holds us in good stead for the years to come. A champion team will always beat a team of champions!

Having said that we still have many areas to improve, watching the ball as opposed to getting in there and getting the ball is still a bad habit, this tentativeness that some of the children display is probably a natural confidence issue that I am sure will improve over time. Providing an option to kick to by running to space is also another area that needs to improve but this will improve over time as the children develop. Next year

we'll continue to focus on these areas and look to introduce other tactics of the game including how to read the play and your role in the team as a dedicated forward, midfielder, defender or on baller.

Coach Clint's Skills to concentrate on over the summer include: Kicking off one step with both feet, kicking on the run with your natural foot. Marking techniques using all 3 marking styles (chest, overhead and in front), handballing using both hands, bouncing the ball stationary (Basic) and bouncing the ball on the run (once the basic skill is mastered).

Finally, I'd like to thank Simon and Andrea Tamke for their contribution to the DPJAFL club during the 2011 & 2012 seasons, sadly (for us) the Tamke's are moving back to Adelaide for season 2013 and on behalf of everyone at the Drummoyne Power footy club we would like to thank you for your contribution to this great club and wish you every success and happiness. Most importantly we would like to wish Josh and Lara every success in your sporting careers. UNDER 11'S BLACK

Coach's Report - Andrew Hamilton (Sydney Harbour 2012 Coach of the Year)



To fully assess the team's performance in the 2012 season, one needs to consider where we started in order to understand where we ended up.

We started with 21 players consisting of 6 players from the 2011 Silver team that I coached, 9 players who came from the 2011 Black and Teal teams, 3 players who had never played before and 3 players who had played in the U11s in 2011 and wanted to play with their mates in 2012.

A major challenge was always going to be how to mould the boys into a team taking into account the diversity in skill and AFL experience so that the team could be competitive against other teams that had been together as a group for 4-5 years in some cases whilst ensuring that the boys had a positive AFL experience.

Did we achieve this - absolutely. Did we reach the heights that we would have liked in the end - not quite.

Other challenges included managing up to 6 players week in week out on the interchange bench and in such a way that all players received a fair amount of game time and for the first time we encountered injuries arising from the increased physical contact associated with the progression to under 11 football combined with the physical development and growth stages of some of the boys instead of the usual illness.

We also offered two nights training - 1 optional and 1 preferred - and introduced fitness work.

The home and away season could be divided into 3 parts.

Whilst being aware of the most suitable positions for many of the boys from early in the season, the first third tried many of the boys in different and unfamiliar positions. While it is important for the boys to diversify especially at still their tender age the boys began to mould better once they were provided with a consistent position or area of the ground to play each week. As a result their performances early on were quite mixed.

The next step for the boys was a transition from just kicking the ball to introducing the use of handball to enhance a running style of play which suited the overall U/11 game style as the ball still spends a considerable amount of time in dispute where neither team has possession. It was surprising how well the boys adapted to this game style.

The final third included the last 2-3 games and gala days and preliminary final where the boys began to play some very good play and run on football. Playing finals football is what we all play football for and while the boys' performance in the second week of the gala day was below the expectations that they had set themselves based on their overall performance they deserved the chance to play in the preliminary final.

Any team who loses their 3 best players will see them struggle and we were no different in the Preliminary Final with Matt Sheridan sick, Blaise McKee injured and Bodey Lambert away. To lose a game due to only 1 quarter or 15 minutes of football and to have recovered from their below par performance the week before was testament to how far the team had come in only 1 season.

Season highlights included:

- Liam Quail and Oscar Stone kicking their first goals for the club
- Nicholas Zadow kicking a goal in the gala day and running on and picking up the ball and handballing to Luke Lawrence who kicked the goal in one of the early round games
- Josh Macdessi's trademark runs out of the backline having picked the ball up and converting defence into attack and following his man and backing himself from the backline to kick goals
- Will Richard's adaptability to the game settling into a key backline position and having a profound impact
- Josh Clarke's goal against Newtown White
- Kieran Corcoran's tremendous use of handball in packs to a player in a better position
- Joshua Hamilton's lead straight up the ground in the gala day, receiving an excellent pass from Matt Sheridan resulting in a goal
- Benji Williams' strong contested marks in the forward line regularly converted to goals
- Luke Lawrence's 3 goals and dominant performance against Teal
- Luke Walton's ruck work and Josh Macdessi's and Josh Clarke's defensive work against Maroubra Black in the Preliminary Final
- Bodey Lambert's never say die attitude and pure and raw honesty
- The communication and understanding that evolved between Jackson Bursill and Luke Walton in the ruck
- Alex Partridge's courage to always place the team before himself in every contest
- Nick Jenneke's 4 tackles in a row against Newtown Red finally receiving a free kick for holding the ball

- Matt Sheridan's amazing strength and tenacity at the football and attack at the player with the ball
- Blaise McKee's return to AFL following 2 years of living overseas and his ability to read the game positioning himself to take possession of the ball
- Alex Medjumurac's 3 goals against Glebe at Jubilee Oval in atrocious conditions
- Blaise McKee's and Bodey Lambert's selection in the U/11 representative team
- Zach Newport's in and under play at the fall of the ball in the forward line
- The improvement in the skill of many players especially Bryson Hart and Harrison Riedel
- The team's dominant win against Wests at Henson Park coming off a very poor performance against Maroubra Red
- The team's performance against eventual premiers Easts Blue where we only lost by 5 goals which largely arose due to a failure to score when kicking with the wind
- The team's 8 individual goal kickers against Newtown White.

As a second year coach, I am still very much in the learning phase and this year presented many new challenges and opportunities.

I am indebted to Adam Newport as my assistant coach and runner, to Michelle Robinson as our Team Manager who allowed me to focus just on the coaching and to the parents for your words of support, help at training, friendships that have been created and permission to allow me to coach your children.

Where we all are next year will be revealed in time and if our paths do go in different directions next year if the boys can take just one thing from this season into future seasons of football then we have achieved a great outcome in 2012.


